Gifts of the Spirit Pt. 01

1

Since we have been studying the Holy Spirit in the last two classes, I would like to continue with more about the Holy Spirit before we get into the Gifts of the Spirit.

2

First we will be looking at the "Offices of the Holy Spirit."
Next we will look at the Ministries (Works) of the Holy Spirit
And then we will briefly identify the Gifts of the Spirit that are given in the Bible

3

“Offices of the Holy Spirit”

When we speak of “The Office” of a person, we are understanding that to be positional, usually a position of authority or service.

4

For instance, when we hear “The Office of the President” we know that it is more than just the office he or she works in.

5

It is his/her position of authority whether it be the President of the United States, or the president of a company or corporation.

6

People can actually hold more than one office, such as President and CEO (Chief Executive Officer), Vice President and COO (Chief Operations Officer)

7

As we study and learn more about the Holy Spirit, we find He has multiple offices, yet has one “Chief Office.”

As we have already learned, the Holy Spirit is a person.

He is not a being and He was not created

8

A being is an angel, a human; also, a creature or beast as we see in Daniel 7 & Revelation, created by God (*elohim*)

When I talk about a being, I am speaking of angels

A being cannot hold a “heavenly position” such as an “Office”

9

A being can be placed in a position, but not that of authority. It seems there is a hierarchy among these beings
They have positions of rank
They have no authority on their own, it comes from and through God

10

We know of three beings, angels, who seem to have held the highest ranks; Michael, Gabriel and Lucifer
They are the only ones in the Bible which we see were given names.

11

Archangel is a designation, not a position or office.
The word, "angel" means messenger and therefore, no angel can hold a position or office.
So let's meet these angels

12

Daniel is the only man in the Bible that is blessed to have encountered both Gabriel and Michael.

The Hebrew word for Gabriel is *gabrî'ēl* and means, "warrior of God" or "man of God."

13

Strong's Concordance definition – "an archangel; the angel God used to send messages of great importance to man; sent to Daniel, to Zacharias, and to Mary" (KJV and NKJV have Zacharias, but NASB and NIV have Zechariah)

14

The Hebrew word for Michael is *mīkā'ēl* (me-kaw-ale') and means "who is like God."

Strong's definition – "one of, the chief, or the first archangel who is described as the one who stands in time of conflict for the children of Israel."

15

Notice that both names end with "el", which is a Hebrew word for God (the one true God, Jehovah)

So, for you younger people, be careful how you name your children

16

The third angel, Lucifer, wanted to hold a position, that of being God, and still wants to, but this will never happen.

The Hebrew word for Lucifer is *hêlēl* (hay-lale') and means "light-bearer."

17

Also, shining one, morning star, Lucifer; and, of the king of Babylon and Satan

Lucifer (Satan) was covered in the Spiritual Warfare Module

18

We first read of Gabriel in the book of Daniel, chapter 8, verse 16: “And I heard the voice of a man between *the banks of Ulai*, and he called out and said, “Gabriel, explain the vision to this *man*.”

19

In Daniel 8, Daniel has a vision of a ram and a goat.
We’re not going to be reading this as it does not pertain to what we are studying about the Holy Spirit

20

However, we read that in his vision Daniel heard two of what he called “a holy one” speaking to each other in verses 13-14

21

Then I heard a holy one speaking; and *another* holy one said to that certain *one* who was speaking, “How long *will* the vision *be*, *concerning* the daily *sacrifices* and the transgression of desolation, the giving of both the sanctuary and the host to be trampled underfoot?”

22

¹⁴ And he said to me, “For two thousand three hundred days; then the sanctuary shall be cleansed.”
¹⁵ Then it happened, when I, Daniel, had seen the vision and was seeking the meaning, that suddenly there stood before me one having the appearance of a man.

23

¹⁶ And I heard a man’s voice between *the banks of* the Ulai, who called, and said, “Gabriel, make this *man* understand the vision.”
Gabriel comes to Daniel and touches him and stands him up.

24

Then Gabriel told him the meaning of the vision.
God, perhaps the Holy Spirit, gave Gabriel the interpretation of the vision and sent him to Daniel.

25

The conversation between the two “holy ones” is interesting and they can be nothing else but angels.
Daniel sees Gabriel again in 9:20-23:

26

“while I was still speaking in prayer, the man Gabriel, whom I had seen in the vision previously, came to me in *my* extreme weariness about the time of the evening offering.

27

²² And he instructed *me* and talked with me and said, “Daniel, I have come now to give you insight with understanding.

28

²³ At the beginning of your pleas the command was issued, and I have come to tell *you*, because you are highly esteemed; so pay attention to the message and gain understanding of the vision.”

29

Gabriel goes on to tell Daniel of the 70 weeks and the Messiah Gabriel appears again in Luke 1 Zacharias was doing his priestly duties in the temple when an angel appeared and was “standing to the right of the alter of incense.”

30

Naturally, Zacharias was afraid and the angel told him to not be afraid, that his prayers have been answered and his wife, Elizabeth, was going to have a son.

31

In verse 18, “Zacharias said to the angel, ‘How will I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in her years.’

32

¹⁹ The angel answered and said to him, ‘I am Gabriel, who stands in the presence of God, and I was sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news.’”

33

Gabriel then tells Zacharias that he will not be able to speak until the child is born because he did not believe.

And, of course, we see Gabriel one more time in verse 26 when he visits Mary

34

“Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city in Galilee named Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the descendants of David; and the virgin’s name was Mary.

35

²⁸ And coming in, he said to her, “Greetings, favored one! The Lord *is* with you.”

Now, let’s meet Michael
We first read of Michael again in Daniel, chapters 10 and 12

36

This is a fascinating story and brings us back to spiritual warfare.

I'm pretty sure Dennis covered this in the Spiritual Warfare Module, but it's always good to see it from a different viewpoint

37

Daniel has another vision in chapter 10.

An angel comes to him, but was detained by the prince of the kingdom of Persia.

38

This can be none other than one of Satan's powerful demons that was keeping this angel from delivering the message to Daniel regarding his prayer.

39

Daniel had been mourning for 3 weeks, not eating and “tasty food, meat or drinking any wine.”

Needless to say, he was very weak

40

¹²“Then he said to me, ‘Do not be afraid, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart on understanding *this* and on humbling yourself before your God, your words were heard, and I have come in *response to your words*.’”

41

¹³ But the prince of the kingdom of Persia was standing in my way for twenty-one days; then behold, Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, for I had been left there with the kings of Persia.”

42

This angel was finally able to deliver the message to Daniel and then had to leave to go back and fight the prince of Persia

At the end of chapter 10, this angel says, “there is no one who stands firmly with me against these *forces* except Michael your prince.”

43

Michael is mentioned again in Daniel 12:1

Then we see him in Jude verse 9: “But Michael the archangel, when he disputed with the devil and argued about the body of Moses, did not dare pronounce against him an abusive judgment, but said, ‘The Lord rebuke you!’”

44

And Revelation 12:7 And there was war in heaven, Michael and his angels waging war with the dragon. The dragon and his angels waged war.

I share this with you to show that the angels do not have any authority on their own.

45

They are given authority by God and sent to do what He commands them to do.

These angels are sent by God, or perhaps Jesus and He gives them orders.

46

Jesus tells Joshua that He is the Commander of the Lord's army (Joshua 5:13-15)

These angels are warriors and therefore would fall under the headship of the Commander, or Captain, of the Lord's army

47

As you can see, these angels have personalities and specific duties. Some are warriors as Revelation tells us and some are messengers.

In Jude 9 Michael, even being a high-ranking angel and archangel, shows he has no authority even to rebuke the devil.

48

He says, "The Lord rebuke you."
What does this say about how we respond to the voice or temptations of the devil?

49

David said we have been made a little lower than the angels (Psalm 8:5 KJV).
If Michael "not dare pronounce against him an abusive judgment" because he has no authority, then we too have no authority and say as he did, "The Lord rebuke you!"

50

Angels speak and are given authority by God and/or Jesus to do the works He commands them to do.
In the same way, as Pastor Rex has been teaching on Sunday, we have been given the authority through Jesus Christ to do all that He has commanded us to do.

51

But we do not have authority to rebuke Satan or his demons. We should not even speak to him or them.

When Lucifer was removed from heaven (Isaiah 14:12-15 KJV; Ezekiel 28; Luke 10:18) he took one third of the angels with him (Revelation 12).

52

They are called demons and evil spirits in the Bible

Lucifer and the fallen angels have no authority

But God allows them the freedom to create havoc on the earth

53

Okay...

Let's take a look at these Offices of the Holy Spirit

The first office of the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Godhead.

54

He is equal to the Father and the Son, yet His role is different.

He is eternal and creator.

We have already looked at Genesis 1 and saw that the Spirit was involved and active in creation

55

He is often seen as the power of or within the Godhead

In Paul's greeting to the church in Rome (Romans 1:3-4) he says, "concerning His Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who was born of the seed of David according to the flesh,

56

⁴ *and declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead.*

Jesus told the disciples in Acts 1:8 that they would "receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon" them

57

And, as we will see later, He is the power that is in every believer

Second, His “Chief Office” is to bring glory to Jesus Christ.

58

John 16:14-15 “He (the Holy Spirit) will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare *it* to you. ¹⁵ All things that the Father has are Mine. Therefore I said that He will take of Mine and declare *it* to you.”

59

In what way does the Holy Spirit glorify Christ?
He glorifies Christ by declaring to us the things of Christ.
The KJV uses the word “*shew*” (*show*) while the NKJV uses “declare.”
NIV uses “make known.”

60

The Greek word is *anangellō* (an-ang-el'-lo) which means: to announce, make known
The Holy Spirit makes known to the believer all the things of Christ. He announces them.

61

Have you ever had the Holy Spirit reveal something to you that you maybe haven't heard before from another person?
It feels like an announcement, like the old Ford commercial where the light bulb lights up.

62

Maybe when you're reading your Bible and though you have read a portion of verses before, this time they light up and you have a "revelation."
You see something in those verses that you have never seen before.

63

That is the Holy Spirit making known to you the things of Christ.
And Christ is glorified in that

64

C.H. Spurgeon said, "He (Holy Spirit) takes of the things of Christ, not to show them to angels, not to write them in letters of fire across the brow of night, but to show them unto us. Within the little temple of a sanctified heart, Christ is praised, not so much by what we do, or think, as by what we see."¹

65

And what are the things of Christ the Spirit shows, or makes known to us?
The Holy Spirit shows us:
1. Jesus is the Son of God.
2. What Christ has done and how He suffered for this dying world – the *propitiation*

66

Romans 3:25

Hebrews 2:17

1 John 2:2

1 John 4:10

67

3. How Christ bore the sins of the world in order to save the world –

John 3:16

1 Peter 2:24

4. Christ is a living Savior, seated at the right hand of the Father

Acts 2:33

Acts 5:31

Acts 7:55-56

69

5. That through Christ, man can be reconciled with the Father – He is the Way

6. Christ is the Word of Truth (John 14:6 “I am the Truth”)

James 1:18

Third, He holds the office of Convincer of Sin, Righteousness and Judgment

John 16:8-11 - And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment:

74

⁹ of sin, because they do not believe in Me; ¹⁰ of righteousness, because I go to My Father and you see Me no more; ¹¹ of judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

75

Isaiah 6:5 So I said:

“Woe is me, for I am undone!
Because I am a man of unclean
lips,
And I dwell in the midst of a
people of unclean lips;
For my eyes have seen the King,
The Lord of hosts.”

76

Fourth, He holds the office of the
One Who Seals the believer
He is the King’s signet ring
used to place His seal in order
that everyone who sees it
knows who it belongs to and
requires His permission to
open the seal.

77

No one has the authority to
open the seal of Christ except
Christ.
His seal protects us from the
evil one

78

2 Cor 1:21-22 Now He who establishes us with you in Christ and has anointed us is God, ²² who also has sealed us and given us the Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee.

79

Eph 1:13 In Him you also trusted, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise

80

Eph 4:30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

81

Fifth, He is the Searcher and Deliverer of Truth

John 16:12-14 "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear *them* now.

¹³ However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth;

82

for He will not speak on His own *authority*, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come.

¹⁴ He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare *it* to you.

83

1 Corinthians 2:10 - But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God.

84

Sixth, He is the Giver of Gifts
1 Corinthians 12:7,11 - But the
manifestation of the Spirit is
given to each one for the profit
of all: ¹¹But one and the same
Spirit works all these things

85

Seventh, He holds the Office of
Appointer;
the Human Resources Officer
of the Church (men and
women to service)
1Cor 12:11b - “distributing
(spiritual gifts) to each one
individually as He wills”

86

Ministries (Working) of the Holy Spirit

1. Gives Testimony and
Witness of Jesus Christ –
John 15:26 - “But when
the Helper comes, whom
I shall send to you from
the Father,

87

the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify of Me.

88

2. The Ministry to Reveal Our Sins (Quality Control Manager)
For all of my life as a Christian, which has been most of it, I have heard pastors, teachers and Christians say that the Holy Spirit convicts us of our sins.

89

I have even said this when teaching, only because I have heard it and believed it.

But on further study and assessment I don't believe this is an accurate statement.

90

We just saw how the Holy Spirit is the “Convincer of Sin” to the unbeliever, convincing and convicting him/her of their unbelief.

The word convict means to judge, condemn and find guilty.

91

I read one article online where the writer said that “the Holy Spirit is the prosecuting attorney.”

How can that be since Jesus is our defender?

The Holy Spirit does not go against the Son of God.

92

He is the third person of the Godhead so it is not possible for Him to do this.

Satan is our accuser and prosecuting attorney.

Satan is the one that causes us to feel guilty and unworthy when we commit a sin.

93

Zechariah 3:1-2

And he shewed me Joshua the high priest standing before the angel of the Lord, and Satan standing at his right hand to resist him.

94

² And the Lord said unto Satan, The Lord rebuke thee, O Satan; even the Lord that hath chosen Jerusalem rebuke thee: is not this a brand plucked out of the fire? (KJV)

95

NASB & NIV use the word, “accuse”; NKJV uses “oppose”.

The Hebrew word for “resist” is *sāṭan* (saw-tan') and means: to be or act as an adversary, resist, oppose.

96

Look what happens next.

Verses 3-4: “Now Joshua was clothed in filthy garments and was standing before the angel.

97

⁴ And he responded and said to those who were standing before him, saying, ‘Remove the filthy garments from him.’ Again he said to him, ‘See, I have taken your guilt away from you and will clothe you with festive robes.’” (NASB)

98

The KJV says, “Behold, I have caused thine iniquity to pass from thee.”

Hebrew word for “iniquity” is ‘āôn (aw-vone’) and means: *perversity, depravity, iniquity, guilt or punishment of iniquity*

99

This is how every person is
cleansed and clothed when
they believe in Jesus Christ
and repent of their sins.

Isaiah 61:10 I will greatly
rejoice in the Lord,
My soul shall be joyful in my
God;

100

For He has clothed me with the
garments of salvation,
He has covered me with the robe of
righteousness,
As a bridegroom decks himself with
ornaments,
And as a bride adorns herself with
her jewels.
But we are all like an unclean thing,

101

Isaiah 64:6 And all our
righteousnesses are like filthy
rags;
We all fade as a leaf,
And our iniquities, like the
wind, Have taken us away.

102

Romans 6:18 And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness.

Romans 8:10 And if Christ is in you, the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit is life because of righteousness.

103

1 Corinthians 1:30 But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God—and righteousness and sanctification and redemption

Philippians 3:9 And be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith

104

All of these verses show that we are no longer guilty of our sinful nature, that we have received salvation and have been clothed in the righteousness of Christ.

105

Our accuser has nothing to accuse us of.

The Holy Spirit does not convict us of the sins we commit in our new lives in Christ.

106

He cannot be a convictor of sin to the believer because He would be standing against us and against Jesus and the Father.

Sometimes the Holy Spirit will speak to us of a wrong we have done through another person.

107

Case in point, David's sin with Bathsheba.

God sent Nathan to David.

David knew he had sinned, but thought he had gotten away with it.

108

Does that sound familiar to anyone?

This account is written in 2 Samuel 12

109

The Holy Spirit speaks through Nathan and he tells the story of a rich man who had plenty of livestock, and had a traveling visitor.

110

Instead of killing one of his own sheep, he went to his neighbor who had a lamb which was hand raised and “was like a daughter to the man.”

111

The rich man took the lamb from his neighbor in order to feed it to his guest.

In verses 5-6, David became very angry with the rich man. He said to Nathan,

112

“As the Lord lives, the man who did this should die! ⁶ He must pay four times the price of the lamb because he did this terrible thing and because he had no mercy.”

⁷ Then Nathan said to David, “You are that rich man!”

113

¹³ Then David said to Nathan, “I have sinned against the Lord.” Nathan said to David, “The Lord will forgive you, even for this sin. You will not die.

¹⁴ But you did things that made the Lord’s enemies lose their respect for him, so your new baby son will die.”

114

God through Nathan, by way of the Holy Spirit, revealed David's sin to him.

It's not that we don't know we sin, it's that we think we are getting away with it and it's actually in our heart that the Holy Spirit reveals our sin to us.

115

That's why David said in Psalm 139:23-24

"Search me, God, and know my heart;

Put me to the test and know my anxious thoughts; ²⁴ And see if there is any hurtful way in me, And lead me in the everlasting way." (NASB)

116

When the Holy Spirit reveals our sin, we need to immediately confess our sin.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous, so that He will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

117

Again, I don't believe the Holy Spirit convicts us of sin because conviction includes condemnation.

And Romans 8:1 tells us, Therefore there is now no condemnation at all for those who are in Christ Jesus.

118

I like the idea of the Holy Spirit being the "Quality Control Manager" in our lives.

He sees to it that we are living the life of Christ and ensures there are no defects (sin) as we present ourselves to God

119

Romans 12:1-2 Therefore I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship

120

² And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect.

121

Okay, let's move on...

Continuing with the Ministries of the Holy Spirit

122

3. The Ministry as Comforter/Helper

John 14:16-17

And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever— ¹⁷ the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither

123

sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you.

When the disciples were with Jesus, they were comforted by His presence; before His death and after His resurrection.

124

Jesus also helped them in many ways; learning about loving and serving others, teaching them His gospel; making them into Godly men.

When Jesus ascended to heaven, he sent the Holy Spirit to take His place in believer's lives as a comforter and helper.

125

The Greek word for "comforter" is paraklētōs (par-ak'-lay-tos) and means:

"summoned, called to one's side, esp. called to one's aid; one who pleads another's cause before a judge, a pleader, counsel for defense, legal assistant, an advocate"

126

(now going back to what I was saying about conviction, this word proves that the Holy Spirit is not acting as a prosecuting attorney and does not convict believers)

127

Strong's Concordance also shows: "to lead them (the apostles) to a deeper knowledge of the gospel truth, and give them divine strength needed to enable them to undergo trials and persecutions on behalf of the divine kingdom."

128

And He does this for all believers

129

4. The Ministry to Teach
John 14:26 - But the Helper,
the Holy Spirit, whom the
Father will send in My name,
He will teach you all things,
and bring to your
remembrance all things that
I said to you.

130

1 Cor 2:9-10, 12-13
(knowledge); teaches us
what He Himself knows;
Verses 9-10 but just as it is
written:
“Things which eye has not
seen and ear has not heard,

131

And which have not entered
the human heart,
All that God has prepared for
those who love Him.”
¹⁰ For to us God revealed
them through the Spirit; for
the Spirit searches all things,
even the depths of God.

132

Verses 12-13 Now we have not received the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may know the things freely given to us by God.

133

¹³ We also speak these things, not in words taught by human wisdom, but in those taught by the Spirit, combining spiritual thoughts with spiritual words.

134

Nehemiah 9:20 tells us that “You (God) gave Your good Spirit to instruct them”

Ephesians 1:17-18 Paul writing to the church in Ephesus and telling them that he was praying for them,

135

“that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of Him.”

136

1 John 20:27 But the anointing which you have received from Him abides in you, and you do not need that anyone teach you; but as the same anointing teaches you concerning all things, and is true, and is not a lie, and just as it has taught you, you will abide in Him.

137

5. The Ministry to Lead and Guide

When we think of a guide, we think of someone who's job it is to take someone to a specific place, to show them all that they are there to see.

138

As a sportsman, I have hired guides to lead me to wild game or fish.

The reason people hire a guide is because they are not familiar with the environment or the place they are visiting.

139

A guide is not going to lead a person into peril, trouble or difficulty, though the journey itself may be difficult, it is not the end result.

The end result should be joy and fulfillment

140

John 16:13 However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come.

141

Acts 16:6-7 Now when they had gone through Phrygia and the region of Galatia, they were forbidden by the Holy Spirit to preach the word in Asia. ⁷ After they had come to Mysia, they tried to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit did not permit them.

142

Acts 8 we read the account of Stephen and the Ethiopian. He was sitting in his chariot reading Isaiah. Verses 29-30 “Then the Spirit said to Philip, ‘Go near and overtake this chariot.’”

143

³⁰ So Philip ran to him, and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah, and said, ‘Do you understand what you are reading?’

Romans 8:14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God.

144

Galatians 5:16-18 I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh. ¹⁷ For the flesh lusts against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; and these are contrary to one another,

145

so that you do not do the things that you wish. ¹⁸ But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

Galatians 5:25 If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.

146

6. The Holy Spirit has the ministry of Intercessor

Romans 8:26 Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought,

147

but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. ²⁷ Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God.

148

Gifts of the Spirit

There are many “Gifts of the Spirit” and the Bible does not provide all of them.

149

If the gifts of the Spirit we find in the Bible are the only gifts, we would be limiting the Holy Spirit to just those gifts and not allowing Him to do other works in believers.
